

I speak for us all when I say there had been high hopes that coming out of a pandemic would return us to the normalcy we had prior to 2020. Families had expressed excitement to reunite with friends and family and to return to regular activities as they once knew. Unfortunately, for so many of our families, that normalcy never came.

More than ever, our families are experiencing significant hardships. Our data shows that our working parents are now having to work more than 12-hour days, without a day off. We are seeing a rise in families having to share housing with others just to be able to afford the astronomical increase in rent in New Jersey. We are seeing more food

This year, more than any other year, we have been in the homes of our Morris County communities and seen deep sadness and stress over providing a holiday experience for their children. Parents have been working hard just hoping to be able to give their young ones some sense of a normal Christmas, but falling short.

Thanks to your generosity, you were able to bring hope, joy, and familiarity to so many of our families. We were met with tears of relief, immense gratitude, and some actual excitement for what turned out to be a beautiful holiday season.



# Pioneering In Action -Schuyler Hamilton House

In 2013, The Schuyler Hamilton house curator had a conversation with fellow Daughters of the American Revolution ("DAR") member, Fran Long (AT&T NJ Pioneer and now Project lead) about the lack of help in maintaining the exterior grounds of The Schuyler-Hamilton House. Many of the Morristown

DAR's members were no longer physically able to keep up the gardening work. "Well," said Fran, "I am a part of the Telecom Pioneers, a community service group at AT&T that gets involved in gardening projects. Maybe I can get some folks interested in gardening at the house." And that is how the Schuyler-Hamilton Garden project all began....

The AT&T NJ Pioneers ("Pioneers"") have been hosting monthly garden maintenance of The Schuyler-Hamilton House in Morristown NJ since 2014. This volunteer event is held during the Spring and Fall months when the garden needs the most maintenance. The event attracts AT&T groups, individual employees and DAR members from all over the state – Paramus, Bedminster, and Middletown, to name just a few. Each year, there is usually

a total over 100 volunteers that give more than

200 hours toward maintaining the gardens. In May 2019, the Morristown

DAR had scheduled a special event to commemorate the "Suffragists Garden" in the name of the AT&T NJ Pioneers. Due to COVID, that event was cancelled.

The Schuyler-Hamilton House (also known as the Jabez Campfield House) is part of the Morristown Headquarters Experience in NJ. It is

open to the public for tours each Sunday from 1-4pm. The house was built in 1760 and is on the US National Register of Historic Places. It houses a research library and many historical artifacts spaning back to the 18<sup>th</sup> century





period. Visitors of all ages come to the house from all US states and many different countries to visit.

The Pioneers are so thankful to all the AT&T employees that come (some multiple times) each year to help at this property owned by the Morristown non-profit - The Morristown Daughters of the American Revolution. Keeping the grounds in top shape was especially important once the house opened for tours post pandemic. The tour guides were able to continue to host visitors outside in the shady backyard at a safe distance amongst the well-maintained flower beds and grounds thanks to our AT&T Pioneers/volunteers.

Visitors to the house have increased three-fold. And 'Yes', some members from the original cast of Hamilton did visit The Schuyler-Hamilton House to film the PBS special behind the making of the musical "Hamilton." This gardening opportunity is one of the best kept Pioneer volunteering secrets. There are many opportunities for the Pioneers, employees, family, and friends to learn about the history of the house and area from the DAR volunteers. There is a wide range of AT&T employees across many business units in NJ who get to know each other during the day. The volunteers are truly helping to keep a public space available to visitors at the Schuyler-Hamilton House.
